
4-H Dog Show Dog Validation

Texas 4-H Dog Show will be held on July 7-9, 2022 at the Montgomery County Fairgrounds in Conroe, Texas. To be eligible for this show, dogs must be validated by January 10, 2022 in 4-H Online. Video instructions are available at https://youtu.be/3NzoljK9Pco



SION 2021 Atascosa County 4-H Deer and Hog Hunting Tournament





We are encouraging our members to be involved in the outdoors so this is a free contest.

Rules:

- All participants must be Atascosa 4-H members enrolled via 4-HOnline.
- 2. Tournament will run all of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Archery Only Season October 2, 2021—November 5, 2021, and Texas Parks and Wildlife South Zone Season (Rifle and Archery) November 6, 2021—January 16, 2022. All entries must be submitted by January 19, 2022.
- 3. The deer contest is limited to white tail deer only.
- 4. Deer Contest categories are: Most points, widest spread, best archery, best overall high fence, and best overall low fence.
- 5. Deer must be killed in Texas and properly tagged. All Texas Parks and Wildlife Hunting Rules and Regulations must be followed.
- 6. We will be using the BuckScore Program to determine the widest spread and best overall scores. The 4-HMember participating must be in the photo holding the deer. Please send a photo of the deer with its head held at a 90 degree angle and another at a 45 degree angle. Please make sure the ears are out and not tucked under your hands. For more tips on how to take the best photo for BuckScore please visit, https://www.buckscore.com/take-best-harvest-photos-scoring-buck/.
- 7. The Hog Contest has one category, The Longest Hog.
- 8. The hog should be photographed with a measuring device that measures from the very tip of the nose to the very tip of its tail, and should have the 4-H Member in the photo with the hog. You can send in two photos one with the Member, the hog, and measuring device; and one with the measurement zoomed in. The measurement <u>must</u> be readable in the zoomed in photo.
- 9. Photos need to be sent to Ashlie.stayton@ag.tamu.edu.
- 10. Photos of 4-H Members and both deer and hogs will be featured in the Atascosa County 4-H Newsletter as well as on the Atascosa County 4-H Facebook page.
- 11. Winners will be announced at the end of the contest and recognized at the Annual Awards Banquet at the end of the year.

2022 Atascosa County 4-H Ambassadors Virtual Bass Fishing Skillathon March 12, 2022—April 17, 2022




Rules:

- \$15 one time tournament fee for individual competitors. \$60 one time tournament fee for teams. You can register at anytime during the tournament. See registration details to the right.
- 2. All individual participants must be enrolled in 4-H through 4-H connect.
- A team is 2-4 members with at least one member being enrolled in 4-H through 4-H connect. All team members must be 4-H Clover or 4-H Member age, 5—19.
- 4. Bass Only—This is a catch and release tournament.
- 5. Must follow current Texas Parks and Wildlife fishing regulations.
- 6. Fish from any lake, river, or pond.
- Boats are not a required.
- 8. You will be given a common item to display with your fish as you post a picture to ashlie.stayton@ag.tamu.edu. That item will not be identified until the afternoon before the tournament starts on the Atascosa 4-H Facebook page. You must measure your fish on a Check It Stick. This measuring stick can be purchased at Academy Sports and Outdoors. The picture to the right is an example of how the posted picture should be uploaded: the fish laying on the Check It Stick with the daily item also visible in the pictures. We have a limited number of Check It Sticks at the Extension Office that can be checked out.
- The measurement <u>must</u> be readable in the uploaded photos. Any unreadable photos will be disqualified.
- 10. You are allowed to catch as many fish as allowed by Texas Parks and Wildlife daily bag limits and submit your top 5 fish over the whole contest towards the winning weight.
- 11. Fisherman must be supervised at all times for safety reasons.
- 12. All fish pictures must be e-mailed by 5 PM on Tuesday April 19, 2022.
- Prizes will be awarded on the number of individuals and teams participating.
 Results will be announced after the close of the contest in the May Newsletter.

TEXAS 4-H PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST 2021-2022 CATEGORIES

It is extremely important that 4-H members, project leaders, parents, and County Extension Agents review the descriptions of each category very carefully. Do not enter photographs into categories that are duplicates from other categories or ones that do not clearly meet the category description. Photographs that do not meet the description of the category will be disqualified.

ANIMALS - DOMESTIC

Photos focusing on the various animals that have been tamed and made fit for a human environment. To be considered domesticated, the animal must have their behavior, life cycle, or physiology systemically altered as a result of being under human control for many generations.

Examples: Chickens, cows, dogs, cats, hamsters, horses, pigs, sheep, goats, etc. All waterfowl (ducks and geese) should be entered in Animals - Wildlife.

ANIMALS - WILDLIFE

Category focuses on animals not typically tamed or domesticated and commonly found in the wilderness or bodies of water throughout the country and world. Photos can be of wildlife in nature, zoos, and/or petting zoos.

Examples: Birds, deer, elephants, snakes, whales, etc.

CATCH-ALL

Photos that do not fit into one of the other categories.

Not allowed: A duplicate photo also entered in another category.

DETAILS & MACRO

Getting in close is the name of the game for this category. The goal is to zoom in close on an object to see its finer details or to make small objects appear life-sized or larger that we do not normally get to see with the naked eye.

Examples: Insect eyes, veins on a leaf, a reflection in a water droplet, etc.

ELEMENTS OF DESIGN

Images use of graphic elements of design. Photos that showcase line, shape, pattern, form, texture, perspective, etc. Photo can consist of any subject matter.

Examples: Line, pattern, perspective, shape, etc.

Not allowed: Digital creations or graphic designs made in software such as Photoshop, inDesign or Illustrator.

ENHANCED

A single photo that has been technically manipulated to be an abstract, panoramic, stitched or composite image. Others variations are allowed as well.

Examples: Software edited composites and creations, images greatly manipulated with a variety of filters, photos with artistic borders, photos stitched into a panoramic, etc.

FOOD

A still life specialization of photography, aimed at producing attractive photographs of food for use in such items of advertisements, packaging, menus and/or cookbooks.

Examples: Cakes/pies, Easter eggs, fruits and place settings, ingredients, sandwiches, Thanksgiving dinner, etc.

Not allowed: A photo of alcohol beverages.

LANDSCAPE & NATURE (NON-ANIMAL)

The focus of this category includes landscapes, outdoor scenics, nature images, sunsets, urban landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes, and farms. Images focus on the beauty of the outdoors. Examples: Gardens/landscapes, outdoors, scenics, etc. Not allowed: Primary subject is a person or wildlife.

LEADING LINE

This image composition technique features lines that draw the viewer's eye from point A to point B, which is the primary subject. Example: A river that begins in the foreground and draws your attention to a photogenic bridge in the background.

LONG EXPOSURE

Also known as time-exposure or slow-shutter, this technique involves using a long-duration shutter speed. It can be used to sharply capture stationary elements of an image while blurring, smearing, or obsuring the moving elements. It is also used in lowlight conditions.

Examples: fireworks, moving water, light traits, Milky Way, light painting, night or low-light conditions, etc.

MOTION/ACTION

The capture of movement within a single photo. The subject appears stopped or "frozen".

Examples: Ferris wheel spinning, sporting events, horse running across a field, etc.

PEOPLE

Photos focus from all walks of life, parenting and family, children, babies, models/fashion, sports, and couples. All individuals in the photos must have provided consent and permission as a subject. If requested, a release will be needed from the photographer and subject.

Examples: Babies, families, kids, portraits, models/fashion, etc.

PLANT/FLORA

Photos of interesting, unique, and beautiful flowers and flora.

Photography can occur outdoors or indoors. Photo subject should be that of a <u>single</u> flower, plant, bush, tree, etc. Large collections of plant/flora should be considered for entry into the Landscape.

S. Nature category.

Examples: A rose, an upward shot of a tree, etc.

SHADOW/SILHOUETTE

A silhouette is an outline that appears dark (typically a single color) with little or no details/features against a brighter background. Recording patterns of light and shade for a desired effect or emphasis is the definition of a shadow. The silhouette or shadow must be the primary subject and focus of the image. Examples: shadows/silhouettes of people, plants, animals, structures, architectures, or natural structures.

Not allowed: reflections

THEME (New)

The 2021-2022 theme is "My Hometown". Show what is special, iconic, unique, or even quirky about your hometown. Capture what makes it exceptional, historic, fun, or simply the best place to grow up.

Examples: statue, an old home, cityscape, natural area, town square, the barber shop, etc.
