HORSE VALIDATION. IF YOU WANT TO PARTICIPATE IN HORSE SHOW YOU MUST VALIDATION A HORSE.

TEXAS 4-H HORSE VALIDATION FOR THE 2022 SEASON IS NOW OPEN IN 4-H ONLINE. HORSE VALIDATION WILL BE OPEN FROM MARCH 1 - MAY 1, 2022.

- FAMILIES CAN SUBMIT PAYMENT OF \$10.00 PER HORSE (\$20.00 AFTER APRIL 15TH, OR \$250 FROM MAY 1ST TO MAY 5TH), IN THE FORM OF A CREDIT CARD ONLY.
 - FROM MARCH 1 APRIL 15, THE VALIDATION COST FOR EACH HORSE IS \$10.00. THE \$10.00 COST IS ONLY GUARANTEED IF THE ANIMAL VALIDATION IS APPROVED BY THE COUNTY OFFICE BY THE APRIL 15TH DEADLINE AND THE PAYMENT IS PROCESSED.
 - FROM APRIL 16 MAY 1, THE VALIDATION COST FOR EACH HORSE IS \$20.00. THE \$20.00 COST IS ONLY GUARANTEED IF THE ANIMAL VALIDATION IS APPROVED BY THE COUNTY OFFICE BY THE MAY 1ST DEADLINE AND THE PAYMENT IS PROCESSED.
- EACH VALIDATION MUST INCLUDE FRONT VIEW, RIGHT SIDE VIEW, AND LEFT SIDE VIEW IMAGES. THE ENTIRE HORSE SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE PHOTO AND MARKINGS SHOULD BE CLEARLY VISIBLE.
- IF THE HORSE IS REGISTERED, A COPY OF THE REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST BE UPLOADED. THESE PAPERS MUST LIST THE 4-HER, SIBLING, PARENT, STEPPARENT, GRANDPARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN AS THE CURRENT OWNER. IF THE OWNERSHIP IS IN THE PROCESS OF BEING TRANSFERRED, PLEASE LIST "PENDING" IN THE REGISTRATION NUMBER AREA. ONCE THE UPDATED REGISTRATION PAPERS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED, PLEASE EMAIL ME A COPY OF THE NEW PAPERS AND I WILL ADD IT TO THE VALIDATION.
- IMAGE UPLOADS MUST BE IN THE FORM OF A .JPG, .GIF OR .PNG FILE. PDF DOCUMENTS ARE NOT AN ACCEPTED FILE TYPE.
- FAMILIES SHOULD VALIDATE EACH HORSE ONLY ONE TIME. ONCE THE HORSE IS VALIDATED, ANY SIBLING WITHIN THAT FAMILY IS ELIGIBLE TO SHOW THE HORSE AT THEIR DISTRICT SHOW AND/OR THE STATE 4-H HORSE SHOW.
- YOUTH VALIDATING A FUTURITY HORSE MUST BE AT LEAST 12 YEARS OF AGE (AS OF SEPT. 1, 2021) AND AT LEAST IN THE 6TH GRADE.

AFTER IT IS APPROVED AT THE COUNTY LEVEL, THE VALIDATION WILL THEN BE REVIEWED AT THE STATE LEVEL. THE FAMILY WILL BE NOTIFIED BY JUNE 1ST IF THERE ARE ANY ISSUES WITH THE VALIDATION AT THE STATE LEVEL.

Section 34. Thank You Letters: Thank you letter deadline – March 15th. All 4-H and FFA members are required to turn in their original thank you letter in an unsealed, addressed STAMPED envelope to their respective Club Manager, Ag Teacher or 4-H Leader on or before March 15th. Club Managers, Ag Teachers or 4-H Leaders may appoint a review committee from within their respective Club/Chapter. Each Club/Chapter will verify the number of letters and review letters to ensure they meet ACLS Thank You letter guidelines. Club or Chapter Representative will provide the ACLS Show Office with a list of exhibitors that have not turned in letters by 5:00 pm on the Friday following the deadline of March 15th. After the letters have been reviewed by the club or chapter, each club or chapter will mail all letters. Any letter not turned in on or before March 15th will be subject to late penalties. Thank you letters are required from all exhibitors of all buyers, add-on supporters and sponsors of awards for all divisions. Information for writing thank you letters will be available to the Ag Science Teachers and 4-H Club Managers, who will be notified by the Show Office when they will be available.

- 1. LATE PENALTIES: A \$100 penalty will be deducted from the exhibitor's check for each week the letter is late and the exhibitor's check will be withheld until letters are written and approved.
 - 2. LETTER GUIDELINES: Thank you letters will be reviewed by a committee and MUST meet the following basic guidelines:
 - a. All thank you letters must be on stationary, letterhead or handwritten Thank You cards to be accepted. Lined stationary or computer-generated letterhead with lines is acceptable.
 - b. All letters must be original and handwritten by the exhibitor to each donor.
 - c. Letters must not be scanned, typed, or computer generated.
 - d. Exhibitors must provide their letter(s) in unsealed stamped addressed envelopes. All envelopes must have exhibitor's name that was used to enter the show and return addresses on them.
 - e. Letter NOT complying with the guidelines will be returned to the exhibitor for revision.
 - f. Pictures will be provided for the top 4 buyers and submitted with the thank you letters. (2021)

Do not forget that pictures are 5" by 7 "and may require a bigger envelope than the stationary you are using. You are required to provide the larger envelope to include the photo and any extra postage for those letters to the top 4 buyers.

Rules:

- \$15 one time tournament fee for individual competitors. \$60 one time tournament fee for teams. You can register at anytime during the tournament. See registration details to the right.
- 2. All individual participants must be enrolled in 4-H through 4-H connect.
- 3. A team is 2-4 members with at least one member being enrolled in 4-H through 4-H connect. All team members must be 4-H Clover or 4-H Member age, 5—19.
- 4. Bass Only-This is a catch and release tournament.
- 5. Must follow current Texas Parks and Wildlife fishing regulations.
- 6. Fish from any lake, river, or pond.
- 7. Boats are not a required.
- 8. You will be given a common item to display with your fish as you post a picture to a shlie.stayton@ag.tamu.edu. That item will not be identified until the afternoon before the tournament starts on the Atascosa 4-H Facebook page. You must measure your fish on a Check It Stick. This measuring stick can be purchased at Academy Sports and Outdoors. The picture to the right is an example of how the posted picture should be uploaded; the fish laying on the Check It Stick with the daily item also visible in the pictures. We have a limited number of Check It Sticks at the Extension Office that can be checked out.
- The measurement <u>must</u> be readable in the uploaded photos. Any unreadable photos will be disqualified.
- 10. You are allowed to catch as many fish as allowed by Texas Parks and Wildlife daily bag limits and submit your top 5 fish over the whole contest towards the winning weight.
- 11. Fisherman must be supervised at all times for safety reasons.
- 12. All fish pictures must be e-mailed by 5 PM on Tuesday April 19, 2022.
- 13. Prizes will be awarded on the number of individuals and teams participating.
 Results will be announced after the close of the contest, in the May Newsletter.




