This contest is open to all Atascosa County 4-H members registered on 4-H online. Grades 3rd- 12th can enter one photo per category. Clover members (grades K- 2nd) can enter 1 photo from any of the categories. You can start to take photos now for the February contest. Cameras can be a point and click, phone, manual, or automatic camera. Photos are submitted digitally for the contest. please see below for the full list of categories. TEXAS 4-H PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST 2023-2024 CATEGORIES

It is extremely important that 4-H members, project leaders, parents, and County Extension Agents review the descriptions of each category very carefully. Do not enter photographs into categories that are duplicates from other categories or ones that do not clearly meet the category description. Photographs that do not meet the description of the category will be disqualified.

ANIMALS - DOMESTIC

Photos focusing on the various animals that have been tamed and made fit for a human environment. To be considered domesticated, the animal must have their behavior, life cycle, or physiology systemically altered as a result of being under human control for many generations.

Examples: Chickens, cows, dogs, cats, hamsters, horses, pigs, sheep, goats, etc. All waterfowl (ducks and geese) should be entered in Animals - Wildlife.

ANIMALS - WILDLIFE

Category focuses on animals not typically tamed or domesticated and commonly found in the wilderness or bodies of water throughout the country and world. Photos can be of wildlife in nature, zoos, and/or petting zoos.

Examples: Birds, deer, elephants, snakes, whales, etc.

CATCH-ALL

Photos that do not fit into one of the other categories. **Not allowed:** A duplicate photo also entered in another category.

DETAILS & MACRO

Getting in close is the name of the game for this category. The goal is to zoom in close on an object to see its finer details or to make small objects appear life-sized or larger that we do not normally get to see with the naked eye.

Examples: Insect eyes, veins on a leaf, a reflection in a water droplet, etc.

ELEMENTS OF DESIGN

Images use of graphic elements of design. Photos that showcase line, shape, pattern, form, texture, perspective, etc. Photo can consist of any subject matter.

Examples: Line, pattern, perspective, shape, etc.

Not allowed: Digital creations or graphic designs made in software such as Photoshop, InDesign or Illustrator.

ENHANCED

A single photo that has been technically manipulated to be an abstract, panoramic, stitched or composite image. Others variations are allowed as well.

Examples: Software edited composites and creations, images greatly manipulated with a variety of filters, photos with artistic borders, photos stitched into a panoramic, etc.

FOOD

A still life specialization of photography, aimed at producing attractive photographs of food for use in such items of advertisements, packaging, menus and/or cookbooks. **Examples:** Cakes/pies, Easter eggs, fruits and place settings, ingredients, sandwiches, Thanksgiving dinner, etc. **Not allowed:** A photo of alcohol beverages.

LANDSCAPE & NATURE (NON-ANIMAL)

The focus of this category includes landscapes, outdoor scenics, nature images, sunsets, urban landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes, and farms. Images focus on the beauty of the outdoors.

Examples: Gardens/landscapes, outdoors, scenics, etc.

Not allowed: Primary subject is a person or wildlife.

LEADING LINE

This image composition technique features lines that draw the viewer's eye from point A to point B, which is the primary subject. **Example:** A river that begins in the foreground and draws your attention to a photogenic bridge in the background.

LONG EXPOSURE

Also known as time-exposure or slow-shutter, this technique involves using a long-duration shutter speed. It can be used to sharply capture stationary elements of an image while blurring, smearing, or obsuring the moving elements. It is also used in low-light conditions.

Examples: fireworks, moving water, light trails, Milky Way, light painting, night or low-light conditions, etc.

MOTION/ACTION

The capture of movement within a single photo. The subject appears stopped or "frozen".

Examples: Ferris wheel spinning, sporting events, horse running across a field, etc.

PEOPLE

Photos focus from all walks of life, parenting and family, children, babies, models/fashion, sports, and couples. All individuals in the photos must have provided consent and permission as a subject. If requested, a release will be needed from the photographer and subject.

Examples: Babies, families, kids, portraits, models/fashion, etc.

PLANT/FLORA

Photos of interesting, unique, and beautiful flowers and flora. Photography can occur outdoors or indoors. Photo subject should be that of a single flower, plant, bush, tree, etc. Large collections of plant/flora should be considered for entry into the Landscape & Nature category.

Examples: A rose, an upward shot of a tree, etc.

SHADOW/SILHOUETTE

A silhouette is an outline that appears dark (typically a single color) with little or no details/features against a brighter background. Recording patterns of light and shade for a desired effect or emphasis is the definition of a shadow. The silhouette or shadow must be the primary subject and focus of the image. **Examples:** shadows/silhouettes of people, plants, animals, structures, architectures, or natural structures.

Not allowed: reflections

THEME (New)

The 2023-2024 theme is "Abandoned". Photographs capturing the essence of forgotten or neglected places, things, or structures; emphasizing its worn and forsaken nature.

Please take all necessary safety precautions around abandoned buildings/structures.

San Antonio Livestock Show & Rodeo Calf Scramble

The eligibility requirements for the San Antonio Livestock Show and Rodeo Calf Scramble are:

- Participants must be be bonafide members of a Texas County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter.
- Participants must have reached their 12th, but not their 18th birthday on January 1 and not be enrolled beyond their Junior year in high school.
- · Participants must be selected by their CEA or AST.
- Participants may only be awarded one (1) San Antonio Calf Scramble
 Purchase Certificate during his/her FFA or 4-H career.

Rodeo Austin Calf Scramble

Rodeo Austin Calf Scramble Requirements include:

- Online entries begin October 18, year prior to Show and will be accepted until all 168 USC spots are filled. Participants are accepted to USC on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- Participants must have reached their 12th but not their 18th birthday on August 31, year prior to Show, and must not be enrolled beyond their junior year in High School.
- Participants must be active participants in a FFA or 4-H program and reside in the state of Texas.
- Each Participant must complete a current USC Entry Form. Incomplete and faxed USC Entry Forms will not be accepted. All information requested on the USC Entry Form must be complete, with original signatures (no copies). The USC Entry Form must be signed by a parent/guardian, contestant and the CEA or AST. 3. Rodeo Austin will not be responsible for any accidents which may occur to any contestant in USC before, during or after USC.

Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Calf Scramble

Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Calf Scramble entries opened October 17th and must be submitted by December 1st

Applicants must be enrolled in and considered eligible in a TX 4-H or FFA at the time of application and if selected, at the time of scramble.

- a. Applicants MUST be United States citizens and MUST possess a social security number.
- b. Applicants must be enrolled in and attending a public or private secondary school in the state of TX.
- c. Applicant must have reached their 14th, but NOT their 18th birthday on Jan. 1, 2024 and not be enrolled beyond their junior year in high school.
- d. Applicant is required to pass the Quality Counts Verification test for entry. Calf scramble entrants will not be accepted without the verification code. The test can be found at https://agrilife.org/qualitycounts/
- e. Applicant must be financially capable to supply any additional funds that may be needed to purchase the heifer or market steer and to feed and care for it.
- f. Applicant must be able to provide suitable facilities for caring and developing a breeding heifer or market steer.
- g. Applicant must be able to devote the appropriate time and attention to the calf and return to the 2025 Show with a heifer or steer that all parties involved will be proud to display.
- h. Applicant and his/her parents/guardian must be willing, and the participant must be eligible to spend the required time away from school and other activities to exhibit and care for the heifer or steer at the 2025 Show. They must also have the required time it takes to submit all monthly reports, essays and business plan.

Quality Counts is required for anyone that plans to register for a Major Livestock Show. If you are a new livestock exhibitor or an exhibitor that has participated before and moved from 5th to 6th grade or 8th to 9th grade you must have an up to date Quality Counts number before you can register for the Livestock Show.



Quality Counts FAQ - Students/Parents

Registration/Access

- How do I access the new Quality Counts system?
 - The new Quality Counts program can be found at: https://agrilifelearn.tamu.edu/s/product/qualitycounts/01t4x000002ciQSAAY

Helpful Hint: Follow the Enrollment Instructions!

- . Can I use the same email address as my sibling to take Quality Counts?
 - No, each individual exhibitor must have their own email address to use for registration.
- I took Quality Counts previously (last year, for example). Do I have to take it again?
 - If you are planning to show at Spring major livestock shows (or other county/local shows that indicate), Quality Counts verification is required.

Helpful Hint: Exhibitors must be verified once as a junior (grades 3-5), once as an intermediate (grades 6-8) and once as a senior (grades 9-12).

- I will probably only show through 4-H (or FFA), but I am also a member of the other organization, which should I select?
 - Select both 4-H and FFA, as applicable. It is best to have both selected just in case! Keep in mind, 4-H affiliation is by county, not individual clubs.

Quality Counts Verification

- · Which shows require Quality Counts verification?
 - Verification on the Quality Counts system is required for all major livestock show entries.
 Additionally, county and local shows may require Quality Counts numbers. Please refer to each show's rules to determine if Quality Counts verification is required for show or contest participation.
- I did not get a certificate to print when I finished Quality Counts. How do I prove I am verified?
 - Quality Counts no longer provides a certificate to print. You received an email confirmation from texasyouthlivestock@ag.tamu.edu upon your completion. This can be kept for your records to confirm verification.
- . I did not receive the confirmation email. What do I do?
 - The emails are automatic and cannot be resent. Please check your spam folders. You may
 contact your County Extension Agent or Ag Science Teacher for the number if you did not
 receive the email



Quality Counts Enrollment Instructions

1. To begin, go to: https://agrilifelearm.tamu.edu/s/login/

Helpful Hint: We recommend using Mozilla Firefox or Google Chrome as your internet source.

Click "Create an account" underneath the blue Log in button if you do not already have an account with AgriLife Learn. If you do have an AgriLife Learn account, log in at this time.

Helpful Hint: You must create or have an account on AgriLife Learn, this is necessary to be able to leave and come back to the curriculum as many times as needed!

- 3. After logging into your account, type "Quality Counts" into the search bar to find the course.
- On the Quality Counts page, under "Quality Counts Level" click on the drop-down menu to select your grade level: Junior (Grades 3-5), Intermediate (Grades 6-8), or Senior (Grades 9-12).

Helpful Hint: For grade level, please enter the grade you will be entering (if between May- August) or enter your current grade, depending on the time of year you are registering in Quality Counts.

- Once you've selected your grade level, click the blue "Add to Cart" button. The course is free, but you must go through the checkout process to enroll.
- 6. Click "View Cart" and then click "Proceed to Checkout".
- 7. Check the box next to "I agree with the Terms of Use," then dick Next.
- 8. To access your course, click the "View my Order" button and then click on the link next to "Access Course."
- 9. At the bottom of the Welcome page, click on "Course Materials"
- 10. Take the Exhibitor Survey to begin the course.

Helpful Hint: It is very important to choose BOTH your 4-H and FFA chapter regardless of which you think you will show through!

11. Once you have completed the survey, copy the access code provided to you.

Helpful Hint: This is NOT your QC number that verifies your course completion. This is a one-time code to open up the learning materials. You will also be emailed this code from surveys@ag.tamu.edu.

- 12. Click the arrow in the top, right-hand corner of your screen to move forward.
- 13. Click the blue "Start Quiz" button and then enter the access code.
- 14. After submitting the access code, move through the course content by clicking on the arrow in the top, right-hand corner of your screen.

Helpful Hint: The course will take approximately 2 hours to complete. You may leave and come back to the course at any time by logging into your AgriLife Learn account.

15. Once you complete the course materials, click "Final Exam" to take the exam.

Helpful Hint: You must complete the exam once you start it, but you can take it as many times as needed to achieve 80% or higher.

- 16. Once you pass the exam, you will receive an email from <u>texasyouthilivestock@ag.tamu.edu</u> with your VERIFIED Quality Counts NUMBER. It is important you check for and keep this message. You may also contact your CEAVAST to obtain your number if you did not receive the email.
- Congratulationsi You have completed the Quality Counts journey and your Quality Counts number is ready for livestock show entries!




